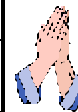

Many Christians have left their country. The Christian population of the Holy Land went down from 30% in the last century to 1.8% today. UMCOR Responds to Philippines Flood...

After torrential rains on Saturday, Sept. 26 the Philippines is struggling with a devastating flood. Over 400,000 people have been displaced. Two-hundred-fifty people have lost their lives and the number is expected to increase.
